History	
<b>castle</b> 	<p>A castle is a building strengthened against attack.</p>
<b>battlements</b> 	<p>The part of the castle used to fend off attackers. Gaps in the battlements allowed arrows to be launched easily.</p>
	<b>drawbridge</b> <p>A moveable bridge used to allow or prevent access to a castle.</p>
<b>moat</b> 	<p>A deep ditch that surrounds a castle in order to protect it. It is usually filled with water.</p>
	<b>keep</b> <p>Strong tower in the centre of the castle.</p>
	<b>Queen Elizabeth I</b> <b>Born:</b> 1533 Elizabeth reigned for 45 years.
	<b>Queen Elizabeth II</b> <b>Born:</b> 1926 Elizabeth has a record breaking reign of 65 years.
