


Year 3/4, Terms 3 and 4 - 'Urban Pioneers' Knowledge Organiser



Explore with fresh eyes the art of the city, then capture a moment in time – perhaps a reflection on a building or a shadow passing by.



- ❖ A **light source** is something that gives out light. Light sources can be natural, such as the Sun, or man-made, such as electric light bulbs.
- ❖ Some objects appear to give out light but are not light sources. Instead these are **reflectors** of lights. For example, 'cat's eyes'
- ❖ A **city** is a large **settlement** where lots of people live and work. We will then explore features of European cities focusing on **Berlin**.
- ❖ **Residential suburb** is an area where there are private houses, not offices and factories.
- ❖ Art that is created outside on walls and buildings is known as '**Urban art**'.
- ❖ **Graffiti** is a form of urban art that is made up of words and pictures that usually show the feelings of the artist.
- ❖ **Banksy** is a world-renowned graffiti artist from the City of Bristol.



Key Vocabulary:

Brandenburg Gate – monument in Berlin, built on the site of a former city gate.

Capital city – a city that is the centre of government of a country.

District – an area of a city or country.

Light source – something that produces and gives out light, such as the sun.

Monument – a building, statue or structure that is built to honour an event or person.

Opaque – an object or material that cannot be seen through.

Reichstag building – A historic building in Berlin that was once used as a parliament building.

Reflect – to send back light, heat or sound without absorbing it.

Residential – an area where there are private houses not offices and factories.

Settlement – a place where people live.

Urban – In, from or belonging to a town or city.
